## Objectives and Deliverables

#### Objectives for the Task Force – Executive Order 32

- •Monitor progress and evaluate all data from state level stakeholders, including data from third-party payers, to understand quality of maternal health care with regards to race, ethnicity, and other demographic and clinical outcomes data,
- •Monitor progress and evaluate data from existing state level sources mandated for maternal care, including HEDIS measure updates to prenatal and postpartum care and postpartum depression,
- •Examine barriers preventing the collection and reporting of timely maternal health data from all stakeholders, including payers,
- •Examine current maternal health programs and initiatives and review available outcome measures,
- •Determine current maternal mental health programs, initiatives, and outcome measures,
- •Evaluate the impact of Social Determinants of Health screenings, and
- •Analyze other available data, including local-health district level data one year post-delivery.
